John Campbell Assignee of William McCall complains of Henry Gullion in Custody & of a plea of Covenant broken for that Whereas the said Defendant on the Sixth day of November in the Year one thousand Seven hundred and Ninety Seven at the Parish of Kentucky in the County aforesaid within the District aforesaid by his Writing Obligatory sealed with his Seal and to the Court now here shown the date whereof is the same day and Year aforesaid did covenant promise and agree to and with the said William McCall in the manner following to wit

" Know all men by these presents that I Henry Gullion
" of the Town of Frankfort hath this day bargained and
" sold, unto William McCall of the said Town a
" Cott of Ground known by the name of George Baker
" Lott for the Consideration of a Note of hand or Arthur
" Conly for the Sum of Sixty Six pounds two shillings
" and ten pence, for the true performance I oblige
" Myself my heirs and Assigns in the penal sum of
" One hundred and thirty two pounds five shillings and
" eight pence to make him or his Assigns a General
" Warrantee deed Given under my hand and Seal
" this Sixth day of Nov^r 1797.

^{Whereas} And afterwards to wit on the first day of December one thousand seven hundred and Ninety Nine at the Parish and County aforesaid and within the District aforesaid the said William McCall assigned the said Writing Obligatory to the Plaintiff by and an endorsement thereon and subscribed with his proper hand of which Assignment the said Defendant had due notice by Virtue Whereof and of the Act of Assembly in such Cases made and provided

And whereas the said Pleff in fact says that the said Defendant hath not
Obed to the said William McCall a General Warrantee deed to the said Lot of
Ground known by the Name of George Baker Cott altho it seems often required

Nevertheless the said Defendant Not regarding his said Covenant in manner and
Form as aforesaid made and altho often required the same to keep hath altogether
neglected and refused to perform the same in this 1800. That altho often
demanded to Obey on the day of in the year 1800 by the said Plaintiff
he has neglected and refused to make a General Warrantee deed to the aforesaid
Lot of Ground known by the Name of George Baker Cott according to the Tenor
form and effect of his said Covenant whereby the Pleff is injured and hath
Sustained damage to one hundred and fifty pounds and therefore he does &c

& Robert White are held and firmly bound unto Nathl
Richardson Sheriff of Franklin County in the sum of Two
Hundred Pounds which Payment well and truly to be made
we bind our selves our heirs &c jointly severally & jointly
by these Presents sealed with our seals and dated this 10th

day of March 1804

The Condition of the above Obligation
is such that where as there did issue on the 28th day
of February 1804 from the office of the Clerk of the
Franklin District a Capias ad respondendum in John
Campbell vs. of William McCall vs Henry Gullian
for a plea of Covenant broken damage one Hundred
and fifty Pounds returnable to the 3rd day of
the March Term of said Court which Capias was the
day led by Allen Richardson on the said Henry


Gullian now if he the said Henry Gullian do
well and truly appear agreeable to the requisition
of said writ then the above Obligation to be
void else to remain in full force Power
and virtue
