 of three thousand dollars to the payment of
 which well and truly to be made to the said
 Commonwealth, we bind ourselves our heirs
 Executors and administrators jointly and sev-
 erally firmly by these presents sealed and
 dated this 9th day of Sept^r 1816

The condition of the above obligation is such
 that if the said Bell Gullion Administratrix
 of the Estate Goods Chattels and credits of
 Josephiah Gullion deceased, do make a true
 and perfect Inventory of all and singular the
 Goods Chattels and credits of the said deceased
 which have or shall come to the hands poss-
 ession or knowledge of her the said Bell
 Gullion, or into the hands or possession of any
 other person or persons for her, and the same
 do make do exhibit into the county court
 of Gallatin county when she shall be thereto
 required by the said Court, and such Goods
 Chattels and credits do well and truly admin-
 ister according to Law, and further do make
 a just and true account of her actings and
 doings therein when there to required by the
 said Court, and all the rest of the said
 Goods Chattels and credits which shall be
 found remaining upon the account of the
 said Administratrix the same being first
 examined and allowed by the Justices of

The said cause for the time being shall be
 -liver and pay unto such persons respectively
 as are entitled to the same by Law; and if it
 shall hereafter appear that any bond will
 and testament was made by the said deceased
 and the same be proved in court and the exor-
 -tor thereof obtain a certificate of the probate
 thereof; and the said Bell Gullion shall in
 such case, being required, render and deliver up her
 letters of administration then this obligation to
 be void, Else, to remain in full force

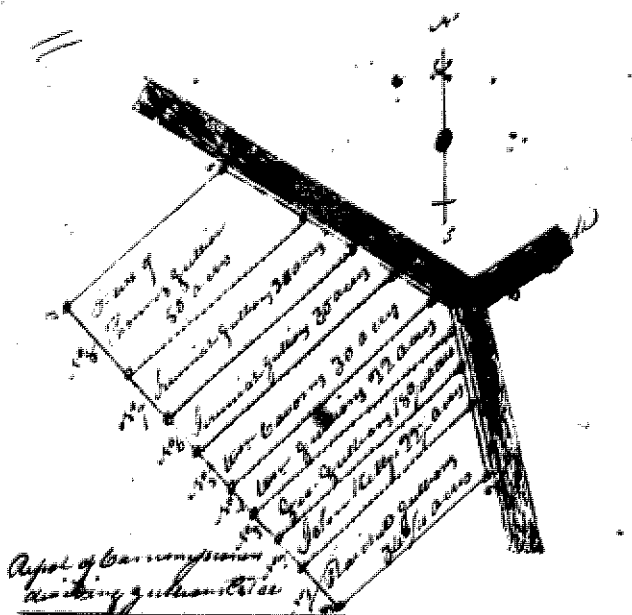

 1819 The undersigned being appointed
 by the County Court of said County
 as Commissioners to divide the
 said Estate of James Gullett
 deceased, amongst the heirs of
 said Gullett dec. we being
 duly sworn as the Law directs
 met at the house of Messrs
 Lewis Laidlaw & Co. said James
 Gullett dec. equably to appoint
 met on the 9th day of Aug.

1819, we proceeded to run the above described land as said, shown
 by the black drawn line, beginning at the figure one and thence to
 2, 3, 4 & 5, from thence to the beginning, being furnished with a
 Certified Copy of said Survey; we then proceeded to mark the differ-
 ent divisions as laid down in the above annexed plat, thence
 by the dotted lines distinguished by their N. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 & 8,
 which said lots, or parcels of land, as laid down, with the
 exception of Lot N. 8, containing 50 acres, as laid down
 for the heirs of Thomas Gullett dec., it being a part of the
 Survey made to Thomas Gullett in his life time, by way of bond
 of conveyance to him or his heirs, &c, it being presumed and
 always understood to be the part of the of said James dec.
 parcel of land, that said James Gullett dec. desired,
 or intended to give to said Thomas Gullett dec. or his
 heirs &c. Therefore we after laying off said 50 acres as above
 described by the N. 8, we proceeded to lay out the balance
 of the land equably to quality and quantity on the lands
 of the Kentucky river, being the upper corner of said Survey
 at the figure 2, as laid down as a stated thence and from
 S. 1/4 Sec. 12 E. 126 poles, with the original Survey to a marked
 Sugar Tree, thence N. 1/4 W. 140 poles to two small landmarks

 from the river S. 49° W. 130 poles to the beginning, containing
 90 acres of land - At the same time and place, the
 principal part of the heirs was present, and made a
 contract with the widow Belle Gullion for her share
 of said lands, which will more fully appear by her Relin-
 quishment to said land, accompanying this Report.
 Also at the same time and place, a Contract
 took place, as respects the negro men Joseph
and Daniel, which said Negroes belongs to said Estate
 between the heirs of said Gullion dec'd. and Belle Gullion
 widow to said Gullion dec'd. which will more fully
 appear, by a Contract accompanying this Report.
